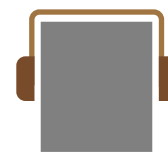

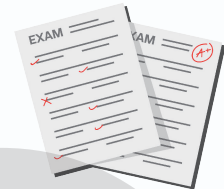




The world of colours and rhythms


Do you know artists use colours and rhythms to 'speak' to us?

Colours can talk

In paintings, colours can show feelings. Red is like fire. It often means anger or excitement. Blue is the colour of the sea. It makes us feel calm. Yellow is a warm colour. It brings us joy.



Music has speed



Music can be fast or slow. Fast, lively rhythms make us feel excited. They help us enjoy energetic activities like running or playing tennis. Slow, soft melodies often bring a feeling of peace. They are suitable for calm moments like doing yoga or sunbathing on the beach.

The colours we see and the rhythms we hear are like secret messages. They help artists share their feelings with us!
