



Grammar explained (1): must / mustn't

We use 'must' or 'mustn't' in situations where we have no choice. We use **must** where we have to do something and we use **mustn't** where we cannot do something.



You **must** keep quiet.
You **mustn't** shout.



You **must** put the rubbish in the bin.
You **mustn't** litter.

Grammar explained (2): come / go

We use the verb 'go' when a person or thing moves away from us. We use the verb 'come' when a person or thing moves towards us.




